

History



Established in 1982, Queensland Veterinary Specialists (QVS) is the first private, specialists hospital in Australia. Our humble beginnings at 263 Appleby Rd, Stafford Heights has led us to who we are today; a multidisciplinary referral and 1st opinion emergency service operating out of 2 purpose build hospitals in Brisbane. Our experienced Veterinarians comprising of Specialists, Registrars, Residents, and Interns.

In August 1998, the Pet Emergency Room was established over the years, it has evolved into a prominent emergency care provider with a large and seasoned offering services 24/7. Notably, Pet ER stands out as the first VECCS certified level 3 trauma centre in Australia. The Pet ER business was founded with three primary objectives:

Emergency Care: To provide round-the-clock emergency care for animal patients in South-East Queensland.

Critical Care: To deliver in-hospital critical care for primary accessions or cases referred for critical care or out-of-hours attention.

Internship Program: To establish an Internship Program, offering a one-year clinical training opportunity in a hospital setting for veterinarians aspiring to pursue advanced training in any veterinary field.

We are a diverse group of specialists, emergency vets, nurses, technicians and support professionals that are committed to working collaboratively to provide compassionate veterinary expertise 24/7. Current disciplines include internal medicine, surgery, emergency and critical care, diagnostic imaging, theriogenology, dermatology, dentistry, anaesthesia and cardiology with immediate plans to expand our services.

Our Hospitals



North Lakes

Vokes and Peters, known for their distinct architectural style, have designed the North Lakes Veterinary Hospital approximately 35km from Brisbane CBD.

Notable is the meticulous planning, evident in the strategic use of natural light and thoughtful placement of spaces. The clinic fosters a calm environment with a courtyard garden and waiting area. The design ensures a light-filled, open, and collegial atmosphere for the veterinary community. Housing 8 consultation rooms, 2 surgical theatres in house CT scanning, DR xray, endoscopy, laparoscopy, large inhouse pathology suite, procedure rooms and intensive care equipment our hospital is well equipped to care for our patients needs.



Stafford

Our veterinary hospital in Stafford, designed again by Vokes and Peters, encompasses an impressive area of 1300 square meters and was meticulously crafted in 2021. Purpose-built by Vokes and Peters in collaboration with our directors, the hospital is strategically located with shops just 400 meters away, offering convenience to both staff and clients. A spacious parking area ensures hassle-free access. Furthermore, exciting plans for expansion and renovations on-site are in progress, all expertly overseen by the same architects. The facility is equipped with 9 consultation rooms, 4 surgery rooms with a dedicated scrub room and sterilisation area, as well as 2 specialised procedure rooms for dermatological and medical procedures. The comprehensive radiology suite features 2 x-ray suites, CT scanning, intraoperative fluoroscopy, and a high field MRI, ensuring advanced diagnostics. The hospital also includes a cat-only ward, isolation spaces, and a welcoming reception area, complete with a designated cat-only waiting space, providing a well-rounded and pet-centric experience.

Our Departments



Surgery

Our dedicated team comprises four specialists, two registrars, and four interns, ensuring our patients receive the highest level of expertise. Our surgical services, available Monday to Friday, extend beyond regular hours for emergencies. Specializing in orthopaedic, soft tissue, spinal, and oncological surgery, our surgeons are equipped to handle a wide range of procedures. From joint replacements and arthroscopy to abdominal surgeries and advanced interventions, we utilize cutting-edge technologies, including Stryker and Arthrex equipment. Noteworthy is our expertise in minimally invasive procedures, offering options like desexing, prophylactic gastropexy, and various biopsies. As a certified center for Biomedtrix hip replacement and pioneers in hip and elbow scoring, QVS stands at the forefront of veterinary surgical care.

Internal Medicine

Comprising a team of five specialists, four registrars, and three residents, we offer unparalleled expertise in a variety of disciplines.

Our Internal Medicine encompasses diverse areas such as Gastroenterology, Haematology, Endocrinology, Respiratory Medicine, Neurology, Cardiology, and Urogenital Disease. Our specialists employ common medical procedures, including Ultrasound, MRI, Endoscopy, and technical procedures such as bone marrow aspirates, CSF collection, joint taps, and feeding tube placement.

For Oncology cases, referrals are seamlessly integrated into our internal medicine and surgery services. Our comprehensive approach to cancer care includes technical procedures like Trucut, Jamshidi, incisional and excisional biopsies, as well as laparoscopic and cystoscopic biopsies when required. We also provide chemotherapy appointments and treatment services.



Our Departments

Critical Care



Our specialised team, with over 35 years of combined clinical experience, is committed to delivering exceptional 24/7 lifesaving care for pets in critical medical emergencies. Led by two critical care specialists and supported by two residents, our team is dedicated to providing unparalleled expertise in critical veterinary care. Supported by a team of specially trained nurses and ICU veterinarians, our facilities ensure continuous gold-standard care.

Patients may be admitted to our ICU through the 24-hour Emergency Department, other specialty departments, or referred directly from general practice veterinarians.

Our Critical Care team handles a wide range of cases, including acute abdomen, bleeding disorders, cardiac disease, endocrine disorders, respiratory distress, trauma, toxicities, and more. Our comprehensive service offers mechanical ventilation, high-flow nasal oxygen, temperature and humidity-controlled oxygen cages, continuous multi-parameter monitoring, blood transfusions, bedside ultrasonography, digital radiography, endoscopic foreign body retrieval, and advanced diagnostic imaging techniques such as CT and MRI.

Emergency

Pet Emergency is committed to serving the communities pet's needs, offering emergency and after-hours veterinary care 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year in both of our Brisbane hospitals. Our team comprises 26 emergency and critical care veterinarians who step in when your regular veterinarian is not available.

With our patients under 24-hour observation and the care of our qualified emergency veterinarians, our open-plan treatment area enables us to admit, stabilize, and monitor multiple cases simultaneously. Our close association with Queensland Veterinary Specialists ensures constant access to leaders in various fields, such as Small Animal Surgery, Internal Medicine, Reproduction, Dentistry, Cardiology, Oncology, and Dermatology. This collaboration allows our emergency clinicians to formulate comprehensive plans, offering ongoing support beyond the initial presentation to our facilities.

Our Internship

What to Expect

Program

The Internship Program is a shared initiative, and since its inception, it has trained over 185 interns. <u>Alumni List here.</u> The internship program is meticulously crafted to identify candidates destined for advanced training, be it clinical residency, nonclinical specialist training, or higher degrees, including advanced general practice. Interns undergo comprehensive training in all clinical disciplines, with a focus on Emergency Medicine, Critical Care, Internal Medicine, and Surgery. Emphasis is also placed on familiarising interns with referral and specialist practice processes, honing their skills in data collection and analysis, and preparing them for manuscript presentations at scientific meetings.

Impressively, 75% of all graduate interns have progressed to advanced training, with 91% of those desiring advanced training successfully pursuing it.

The practice takes referrals from approximately 500 veterinarians in Australia. We see between Pet ER and QVS, approximately 25,000 referral cases per annum with a split between approximately 80% canine and 20% feline.

The approximate breakdown by service is as follows:

- Small Animal Surgery (incorporating orthopaedics, soft tissue surgery): 2500 cases
- Small Animal Medicine (incorporating canine and feline internal medicine, diagnostic imaging, theriogenology, oncology): 4500 cases
- Dermatology: 3000 cases
- Emergency Medicine and Critical Care: 15000 cases

OUR GOALS

- To provide Interns with extensive exposure to and training in clinical and technical aspects of the disciplines of Internal Medicine, Surgery, Emergency Medicine and Critical Care.
- To provide Interns with an intimate understanding of the referral process.
- To assist Interns to identify career goals and aspirations.
- To encourage Interns to seek additional training after the Internship and to actively promote and assist Interns in seeking that training; including assistance with the preparation of applications.
- To encourage evidence-based, scientifically-driven clinical practice in Interns and others.
- To provide training in advanced veterinary scholarship, including speaking to professional audiences and the preparation of scientific manuscripts.
- To foster a sense of professional fellowship among former and current Interns, and among all current and former clinic employees.
- To organically grow an international network of graduate (past) Interns to assist current candidates.

Intern Clinical Responsibilities – Pet Emergency

The intern is responsible for:

- Primary accession emergency medicine (including consultations, diagnostics, treatment and hospitalisation) according to Pet Emergency protocols during Pet Emergency shifts; under the direct or indirect supervision of senior staff.
- Critical care of hospitalised patients as directed by the primary clinician who may be: a. Specialist b. Referring general practice veterinarian c. Pet Emergency clinician 3. Discharge of Pet Emergency hospitalised cases.
- Communication with PE and QVS clinicians, owners and referring veterinarians in person, or by phone or email.
- Quick and accurate completion of medical histories according to Pet Emergency protocols.
- Use of senior Pet Emergency clinicians and QVS referral back-up when necessary for EMCC cases.
- Contribution to work on Public Holidays and weekends and at night.
- Participation in and contribution to rounds, seminars and continuing education.
- Participation in staff meetings and basic practice management.
- Assisting lay staff with the duties of veterinary nursing and reception.

- Demonstrate a developing interest in and commitment to a specific discipline within veterinary science.


Intern Scholarship Responsibilities

- Prepare Practice Protocols, Client Information Sheets and Social Media Stories (following established guidelines).
- Learn a standardised approach to CPR under the RECOVER initiative.
- Participate in didactic training; including seminar days, biweekly tutorials, journal club and M&M rounds.
